Kali - Background with Department of Natural Resources, Disaster Response, FEMA

- Currently Emergency Manager for Sound Transit
- Based her campaign on
 - o need to diversify council with LGBTQI representation
 - urban forest management
 - o advocacy for all modalities of sustainable transportation

Karen - Microsoft background

- Based her campaign on tenacity for community representation of
 - development
 - traffic
 - communications
- Wants to be a city leader in
 - efficiency
 - o affordability
 - attainability
 - o city-wide representation
- Compared city to stages of child development, identifying favorite times and challenging times
- Communication needs repeated messages, visual images, transparency
- When discussing development, word choice is very important. I'm in favor of planning our future which includes planning for a vibrant town center so that we can thoughtfully manage our growth very intentionally. Typically, those who promote housing options are mischaracterized as pro-development which of course is not the case.

Amy - Background as a designer, hopes to

- o change design, content of city newsletter
- have a website update
- create a dashboard for easily understood/digested up to the minute "state of the city"
- Based her campaign on
 - o climate
 - o meeting needs for residents through Town Center development
 - o diversity representation, especially cultural
 - o common goals/alignment of city council to move the city forward
- All agreed Town Center development and affordable housing is a high priority.
- They are surprised at time it takes to be a City Councilmember.
- Communications challenges arise from lack of newspaper, ways to communicate with non-tech users.
- They want engagement with public comment, emails, and phone calls to hear from the community.
- They desire transparency and accountability to the community

Seniors in Sammamish

- Tom expressed need for part time Program Coordinator.
- Councilmembers agreed we need to rebrand and take Senior out of our name.
- We could help city with comprehensive database that identifies volunteers' skills, interests, expertise.
- City could help us with communication about program offerings and transportation assistance.
- Affordable housing developed with city support is a priority for older adults.
