Ben's Background

- At University Place when loaned to City of Sammamish at the request of Mike Wilson in 2000
- 3rd employee of the city, 1st in Public Works
- Office was located near Safeway on north end of Sammamish
 - 1 year turned into 15 years as a city employee
 - 1st City Manager
 - o 2016 retired from Public Service, served as consultant
 - Now focuses on family and just became a grandparent in March 2022
- Currently serves as a volunteer Senior Advisor for City Managers Association
 - Works with city managers, cities with challenges, and their leaders

Guidance for Sammamish Seniors Development:

- Contacted Scott McColl, current city manager
- Recommended continued broader conversation with city
- Acknowledged greatest need for older adults is decreasing their social isolation
 - Invite them to volunteer
 - Become mentor to youth, both HS and college age
 - Offer to help older adults prepare their annual tax forms
 - Participate in an environmental project
 - Adopt a street for clean-up and maintenance
 - Identify projects that benefit the entire community, not just seniors
 - Benefits of volunteering for older adults
 - Good for heart health
 - Decreases bone loss
 - Teaches new skill sets
 - o Improves mental cognition
 - Satisfaction with giving back to your community

Ben's Reminders:

- We are a young city and it will take time to develop a program as mature as surrounding cities
- Identify diverse funding streams
- Work with other local nonprofits for support
- Identify national nonprofits who have established senior support programs
- Identify a City Council champion and garner support from at least 3 more council members
- Look again at current properties for program housing
- Lodge at Beaver Lake, Central Washington University campus, YMCA all good possibilities
